

## **I-375 RECONNECTING COMMUNITIES PROJECT** PREVIOUS I-375 Boulevard **Alternatives Considered**


[2014-2016] The project's Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study identified six alternatives for analysis.


















## I-375 RECONNECTING COMMUNITIES PROJECT CURRENT New I-375 Boulevard

[2017-2022] The six PEL alternatives were shared with stakeholders for their review and feedback, then screened by MDOT, the City of Detroit, and other governmental agency partners (FHWA and SEMCOG).

**Alternative 5** moved forward for further analysis and refinement.





## [ 2025 ]

The **current design for the new I-375 boulevard** includes upgrades to PEL Alternative 5, like those shown below, that address stakeholder feedback.
